## Dr. Madhukar PAI

Assistant Professor Department of Epidemiology, Biostatistics & Occupational Health McGill University

Dr Pai did his medical training and community medicine residency in India. He then completed his PhD in epidemiology at the University of California, Berkeley, and a postdoctoral fellowship at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF). He is currently an assistant professor of epidemiology at McGill University in Montreal. In addition, Dr Pai is a Consultant for the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and he co-chairs the Stop TB Partnership's Working Group on New Diagnostics. He also serves as a member of the Stop TB Partnership's Coordinating Board. Dr Pai is a Honorary Professor at the University of Cape Town, South Africa, and a Professor Extraordinary at Stellenbosch University in South Africa. He is on the editorial boards of the International Journal of TB and Lung Disease, PLoS Medicine and PLoS One.

In his research, Dr Pai combines three major areas of interest: epidemiology, infectious diseases, and global health. Specifically, he works on new diagnostic tools for tuberculosis. Dr Pai has several research grants, including a New Investigator Award from the CIHR, and more than 100 peer-reviewed publications. For his research contributions, he received the 2007 Union Scientific Prize from the International Union Against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease (IUATLD).
