





## Strong country-level presence – CFCS


# Strong country-level presence - CFCS (cont)

Initial years focused on creating & supporting community participation initiatives

cFCS augmented to take a country approach and link with STP Platforms

- FOCUS ON COUNTRIES RATHER THAN PROJECTS: For ongoing and sustainable investments in CRG to end TB.
- ADDITIONAL COUNTRIES: CFCS is now supporting 27 HBCs.
- COUNTRY ONBOARDING PLAN: More comprehensive country orientations on CRG, STP, reporting requirements and the importance of communication and collective advocacy.
- STRAGEIC ALIGNMENT AND SUPPORT FROM STP DISEASE ADVISORS AND BY EXTENSION PARTNERS (NTP, TGF, USAID etc): For visibility, longevity and ongoing and sustainable investments in CRG
- MONITRING AND EVALUATION:
   Improved data for action, best CRG advocacy practices for South-to-South learning





## **Country-level STP Platforms**

- ► 30 active STP Platforms in both donor and implementing countries
- 17 STP
   Platforms are supported through grants and TA





# Country-level STP Platforms (cont.)

- Tajikistan: engagment of pop stars and celebrities as TB champions to increase the visibility and profile of TB.
- Cambodia: broad media engagement in press and talkshows mainstreaming discussions on ending TB.
- Pakistan: high-level dialogue with President H,R DR, Arif Alvi and national leaders on ending TB
- Kenya: Mobilising celebrities and communities in a national TB human rights campaign on ending TB stigma and discrimination and access to services.
- DR Congo: mapping of 7 Key Vulnerable populations and facilitation of representatives of each group in national TB governance
- and many, many others! + Nigeria, Ukraine and Indonesia are part of the Board discussion today











## **Countries We Support**

#### Challenge Facility for Civil Society (27 countries, six regions, one global)

- Africa: Cameroon, DR Congo, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Malawi, Mozambique, Nigeria, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe
- Americas: Peru
- Asia-Pacific: Bangladesh, Cambodia, India, Indonesia, Nepal, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Philippines,
   Viet Nam
- Eastern Europe Central Asia: Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Ukraine
- Global & Regional Coordination Grants are supported at the Global Level for national TB survivor networks and at the regional level in Anglophone and Francophone Africa, Asia-Pacific, Eastern Europe Central Asia, Latin America-Caribbean, and Middle East North Africa.


#### National Stop TB Partnership Platforms (17 countries)

- *Africa*: DR Congo, Ghana, Kenya, Mozambique, Nigeria, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe
- Americas: Brazil (as a Challenge Facility sub-grantee)
- Asia-Pacific: Afghanistan, Cambodia, Indonesia, Pakistan,
- Eastern Europe Central Asia: Kazakhstan, Tajikistan, Ukraine
- STP also works with STP Brazil through CFCS, and with Japan, Korea and Italy.



# Community-led monitoring Onelmpact – 23 countries

- Innovative digital platform and mobile application system
- Empowers people affected by TB to claim their rights, access health and support services, and report and eliminate TB stigma and discrimination
- Addresses TB challenges at the individual and community levels
- Generates essential information and data for advocacy and action
- Initial pilot in Tajikistan; ready for expansion in Ukraine, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, DRC, Cambodia, Mozambique, Pakistan, Indonesia and Philippines
- 13 new countries: Cameroon, Ghana, Uganda, Ethiopia, Malawi, Kenya, Nigeria, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Peru, Tanzania, Indonesia
- 2 new regional work in Francophone and Anglophone Africa
- Adapted for real time bi-directional CLM of TB, COVID and HIV.


- TB Key Population Size Estimation (under development)

## Engagement, development & data for action


- Participation of TB survivors and civil society in national TB processes, structures and forums. Examples:
   CCMs (Cambodia), Program Reviews (Kenya), Global Fund C19RM funding request (Cameroon). Country profiles are developed
- Strengthening and engagement of developing country NGO delegation and affected community delegation for advocacy
- Data for action: Key findings of CRG assessments have been peer reviewed and <u>published</u> in the Harvard Health & Human Rights Journal

## **UNHLM** targets & commitments to end TB

- ► The UNHLM on TB contains clear targets on prevention, diagnosis, treatment, AMR, funding etc.
- ▶ The Declaration also contains clear commitments on CRG and partnerships, including:
  - End TB stigma and discrimination
  - Access to medicines
  - Removing legal and policy barriers
  - Gender equity
  - Participation of TB key and vulnerable populations
  - Psychosocial support
  - An equitable and human rights-based approach
  - Multisectoral accountability
- Communities, with support for STP tools and grants, are building evidence, strengthen capacity and inform advocacy to overcome CRG barriers and finding the missing people affected by TB.
