- Deadly Divide Report 2.0



Subject: Dates of the 2023 UN High-Level Meeting on TB

Your Excellency,

Please accept our greetings on behalf of the Stop TB Partnership and the 1044 signatories from 91 countries listed below representing civil society, TB survivors and people affected by tuberculosis (TB), private sector, parliamentarians, and researchers. We are committed to ensuring that the world reaches the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and ends TB by 2030.

We thank you for your leadership as the President of the 77th Session of the UN General Assembly (UNGA) in responding to the many pressing global challenges that have arisen during your Presidency.

This year's UNGA is a critical moment in the fight against TB. Although the world has made impressive progress in the fight against COVID-19, the global TB airborne pandemic continues to affect millions of people and the world has suffered major setbacks. The 2022 WHO Global TB Report showed that 10.6 million people fell ill with TB in 2021, an increase of 4.5% from 2020 - the first time in two decades that the number of people sick with TB has increased. Deaths were also up, rising to 1.6 million from 1.5 million in 2020.

Unfortunately, the available funding in 2021 for TB implementation, research and development represented tess than half of what is needed and what countries committed to in the 2018 High-Level Meeting (HLM) on TB Political Declaration.

We believe its critical that the 2023 HLM on TB take place on Friday, 22nd September 2023 during the UNGA High-Level Week, alongside the HLMs on Pandemic Prevention Preparedness Response (PPPR) and Universal Health Coverage (UHC). This is the most effective way to ensure the highest level of participation by Heads of State and Government and to regain the momentum that enables the world to make progress on TB, PPPR and UHC. The Political Declaration and HLM remain the main global mechanism for agreeing global TB targets and action, as well as mobilizing the political commitments crucial for their implementation.

On behalf of the organizations listed below and the millions of people around the world affected by TB, we hope you will consider our request. We stand ready to actively support you in the preparations for the HLM. Together, we can save lives and protect communities and health systems by putting the world back on track to ending TB by 2030.

Your excellency, please accept the assurances of our highest consideration.

 - Panel 1: Accelerating multisectoral actions to ensure equitable high-quality peoplecentred tuberculosis care, and addressing determinants of tuberculosis in the context of universal health coverage;
 - Panel 2: Scaling up adequate and sustainable national, regional and international financing to ensure equity in tuberculosis service delivery, innovative strategies, as well as for the research and development of new diagnostics, vaccines and medicines;
- Closing Session


Multistakeholder Hearings (cont)

- Participation (as listed in Modalities): UN agencies, civil society, populations and communities vulnerable to tuberculosis, private sector, academia, medical and scientific associations, Indigenous Peoples, representative organizations of people living with, at risk of and affected by tuberculosis and HIV coinfection, of persons with disabilities and community organization
 - Stop TB and WHO submitted list of recommended speakers based on inputs from partners to President of the General Assembly who will make final decision based on geography, age, gender, variety, etc.
- Registration open until 7th April Stop TB pressing for registrations to be confirmed asap to support Visa applications
- "Activation week" door to door missions visits 1-7 May in NY






Key Asks Process


