BERLIN AND GETTING AROUND

Transportation from the two international airports:

Tegel Airport

Taxis at Tegel Airport can be found in Terminal A at Gates 6–9 and outside Terminal C and E.

Taxi fare to the Hotel de Rome is approximately 25 €.

Schönefeld Airport

Taxis at Schönefeld Airport are found outside Terminal A.

Taxi fare to the Hotel de Rome is approximately 50 €.

The neighborhood:

Buzzing with the energy of a city reborn, Berlin is a European capital like no other. The venue for the meeting is located in the historic district of Mitte. Within walking distance are the Friedrichstrasse and the Gendarmenmarkt, and a few minutes on the <u>U-Bahn</u> train will take you to historical landmarks such as the Brandburg Gate, Museum Island, Alexanderplatz and the Reichstag.
